RE: 2017 Congressional Art Competition

The 2017 Competition

Each spring, the Congressional Institute sponsors a nationwide high school visual art competition to recognize and encourage artistic talent in the nation and in each congressional district. Since the Artistic Discovery competition began in 1982, more than 650,000 high school students have participated.

Students submit entries to their representative's office and a winner will be chosen. Winners are recognized both in their district and at an annual awards ceremony in Washington, DC. The winning works are displayed for one year at the U.S. Capitol.

The Rules

All entries must meet the following criteria:

- Be two dimensional
- Be no larger than 26 inches wide by 26 inches tall by 4 inches thick when framed
- Not weigh more than 15 pounds, including frame
- Be original in concept, design, and execution and may not violate any U.S. copyright laws.
- The Student Information and Release Form is attached to the back of the artwork

Submission

To submit a piece of art, bring it to any of Congressman Wittman's offices by April 28th. Please call the office to make an appointment to drop off your artwork. Please note: the Tappahannock Office will be closed the week of April 24th.
